(1)=1st wife, etc.; dau.=daughter; instead of repeating the name of a place in the same paragraph, initials only are given; in writing matter for printer use only one side of sheet, use note or letter size paper; leave at least an inch space at the top and a half inch space at left side of each sheet; use two sheets only for a chapter; always indicate the Book to which the records belong; in other letters turn sheet on end, so the foot of one page will be top of next page. Any person whose record shows their death before 20 years of age will be considered as dying unmarried and their names will not appear the second time unless for some special reason. Write all middle names in full. In giving dates—give day, month, year. Answer all questions as fully as possible and give names of such people as you think may be able to complete the record. Old newspaper files, tomb stones, cemetery, church, school, town, county and probate, records and family bibles should be examined and old people consulted. In preparing records for publication, be sure and include the information suggested by the following:

On April 17, 1849, Mr. Thomas Cotton Lewis () of Portsmouth, Ohio, and Miss Nancy Anderson Gregg, of Waterford, N. Y., were married at Chillicothe, O., by Rev. Carson. The groom was a mechanic, a widower with two sons and two daughters, the younger of whom, Martha F., was at the wedding. The bride was a would-be western school teacher. The next day they drove to Portsmouth, where they have lived ever since.

On April 17, 1889, the bride and groom of forty years ago celebrated their anniversary, surrounded by their living children, and some of their grandchildren. Father and mother, side by side at the head of the table, showed their years, 84 and 75 respectively, but rejoiced to see again around the family board all their living children. At father's right sat Charles Barr Lewis, the eldest, of Cheviot, O. Charley's wife and three daughters could not be present, for various reasons, but he dropped everything to meet all at home again. At mother's left sat Mrs. Sarah Ann (Lewis) Simmons, the next eldest, of Lawrence, Kan. Beyond her sat John Quincy Lewis, Jr., and Mabel Sanfferer Lewis, while Mrs. Lucy Barbara (Sanfferer) Lewis, wife of John, had prepared the excellent dinner, and saw that it was properly served.

It would have added much to our pleasure if the other daughters-in-law and grand-children had been present, but considering the circumstances their absence was excusable; but all were spoken of with love and its good wishes. And the days of the home life of thirty to forty years ago, with the marriages and incidents peculiar to each of our families since. Present—father, mother, three sons, two daughters, one son-in-law, one daughter-in-law,

four grand-children and mother's sister. Absent—three daughters-in-law and fourteen grand-children. May we all meet above.

The Lewis family of Eastern Virginia is of Welch origin. Their ancestor, General Robert Lewis, (whose name is favorably mentioned in English history) came from Wales to Gloucester-co., Virginia, in the latter part of the 17th Century, and there lived and died. His son Robert, who also lived and died in Gloucester had three sons, Fielding, John and Charles, of the last two, I have received no account. 1638.

Mr. Fielding Lewis, of Wyanoke, Charles City-co., was doubtless a descendant of one of them. Colonel Fielding Lewis, son of the second Robert, removed to Fredericksburg early in life, was a merchant of high standing and wealth, a vestryman, magistrate and burgess, and during the Revolution, being a genuine patriot, superintended the manufacture of arms in the neighborhood. He was twice married, his first wife was a cousin, and his second the sister of General Washington. One child only, out of

three by his first wife lived to any considerable age, his name was John, he moved to Kentucky, and left a posterity there. The children of Col. Lewis by his second wife, Betty Washington, were six—Fielding, George, Elizabeth, Lawrence, Robert and Howell. Fielding died in Fairfax-co., leaving descendants; Elizabeth married Mr. Charles Carter, and was one of the most interesting and exemplary of Christians. George was a captain in Baylor's Regiment, and command of Gen. Washington's life guard. In his arms General Mercer expired on the field of battle of Princeton, towards the close of the war, he married and settled near Berryville in Old Frederick, and took an interest in the affairs of the church at that Parish. After some years he removed to Fredericksburg, and thence to King George dying at his seat Marmion in 1821. He enjoyed the highest confidence of George Washington being sent by him on a secret expedition of great importance to Canada. Mr. Lawrence Lewis, of whom we have spoken above, was aid to Gen'l Morgan in his expedition to the West to quell the insurrection in Pennsylvania. Mr. Robert Lewis, fourth son of Col. Fielding Lewis was the private secretary of Gen. Washington during a part of his Presidential term, in the year 1791, he took up his residence in Fredericksburg, where as private citizen, as mayor of the town and as a communicant of the Episcopal Church, he was universally esteemed and beloved.

His daughter Judith married the Rev. E. O. McGuire, who has so

long been the minister of the Episcopal Church in Fredericksburg. Mr. Howell, the fifth and last son of Col. Fielding Lewis moved to Kanawha-Co., where some of his posterity still reside.

There is some mistake here—for this is from the Marshall family, not from the Lewis records.

THE ROBERT LEWIS FAMILY.

1. Gen. Robert Lewis, of Beecon, Wales, came to America about 1640, with a grant of land from the Crown. He settled in Gloucester-co., Virginia. His children were: 1st, Major William Lewis, and 2d, John Lewis.
